DEPUTY GOVERNOR INAUGURATES SAARCFINANCE SEMINAR ON SME (SMALL & MEDIUM ENTERPRISE) FINANCE

The Deputy Governor, State Bank of Pakistan, Mr. Mansur-ur-Rehman Khan inaugurated a three-day Seminar on 'SME Finance' at Islamabad on 20th November, 2006. In this regard, various activities take place which include, among others, hosting of Seminars/Workshops, etc. on topical issues.

This Seminar was the third event in the series. Prior to this, the State Bank of Pakistan, under aegis of SAARCFINANCE, had arranged two Seminars, titled "Financial Sector Assessment" in October 2002, followed by another on the subject of "Conduct of Monetary Policy and Management of Capital Flows" in August 2005.
