SBP asks General Public to exchange Rs.5 Bank Notes with Rs.5 coins

The State Bank of Pakistan has asked the commercial banks to stop issuing notes of Rs.5/- denomination with effect from 1st February, 2005.

All branches of commercial banks and the field offices of SBP Banking Services Corporation will, however, freely collect/accept Rs.5/- bank notes from the members of the general public up to 30th June, 2005 in exchange of these notes with coins of Rs. 5/or bank notes of higher denominations.

It may be pointed out that Rs.5/- denomination notes in circulation will continue to be the legal tender upto 30^{th} June, 2005.

The State Bank has advised the members of the general public to exchange the bank notes of Rs.5/- with Rs.5 coins from any branch of a commercial bank or a field office of SBP Banking Services Corporation upto 30th June, 2005 because Rs.5/- bank notes will cease to be the Legal Tender with effect from 1st July, 2005.

It may be recalled that the SBP Banking Services Corporation had stopped issuing Rs. 5/- denomination bank notes from all its field offices with effect from 1st July, 2004.
