Figure 1. Export During July-December

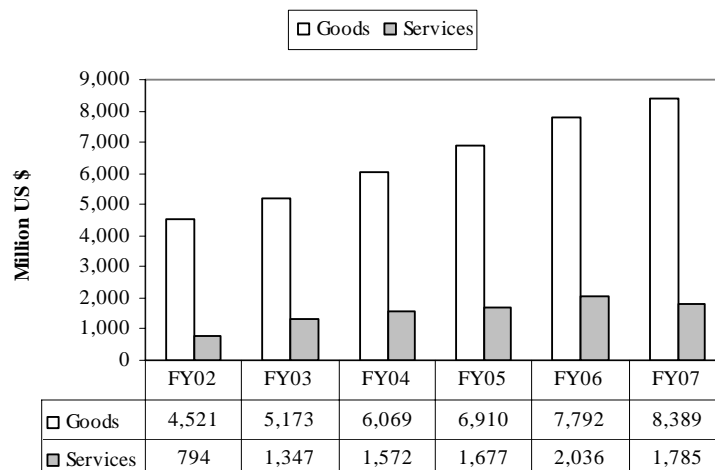
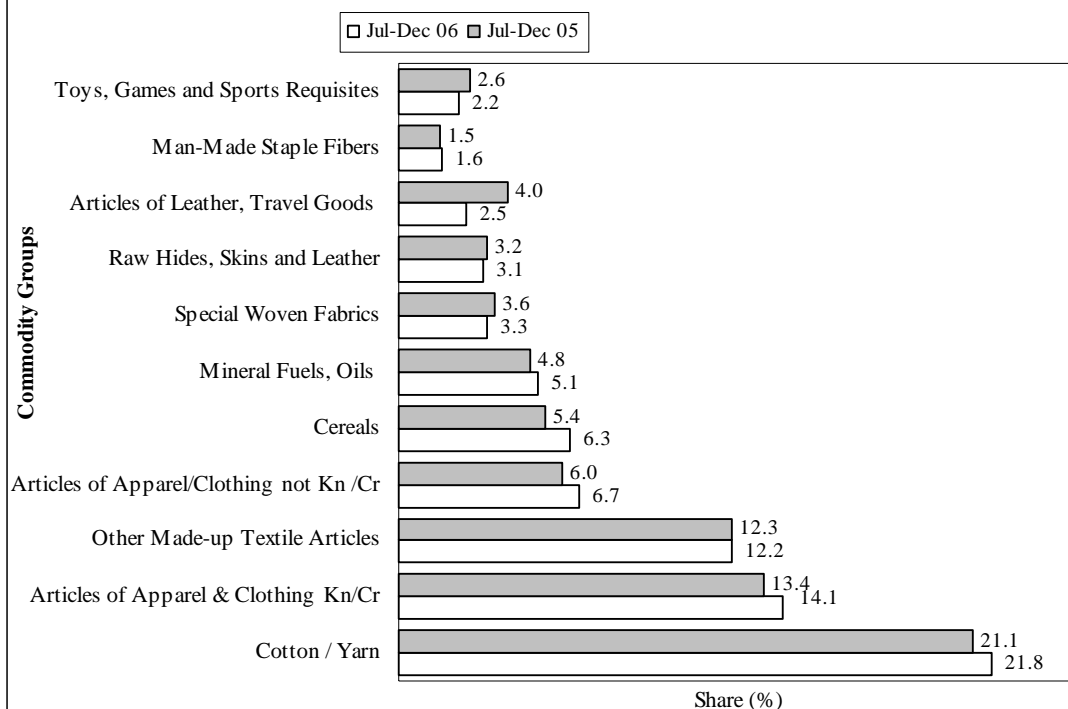

Note: - The share is based on the share of commodities in export receipts (banks) only

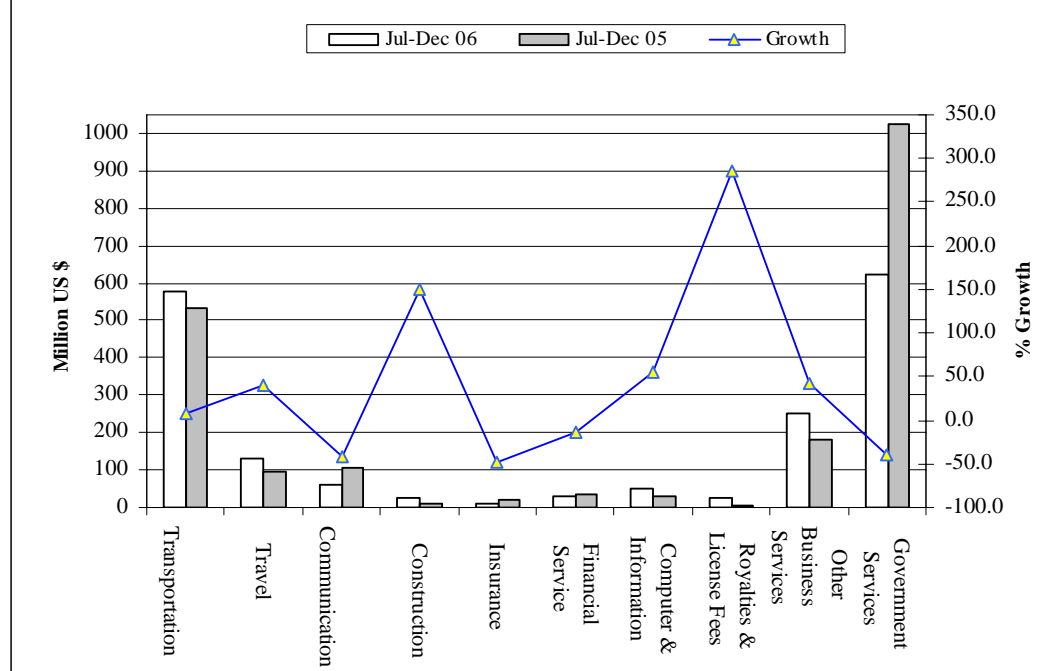
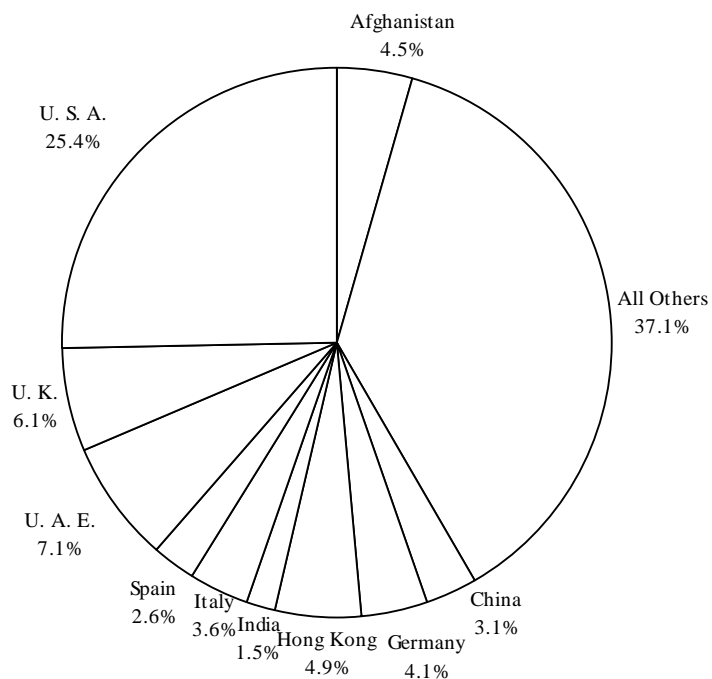
Figure 3: Export of Services

Note: % Share is based on Export Receipts through Banks

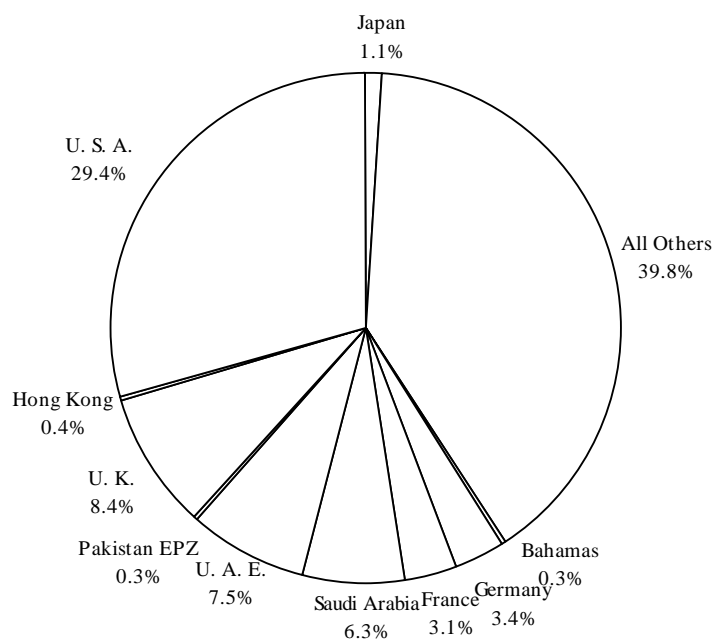
Figure 5: % Share of Major Countries in Export of Services During Jul-Dec 2006

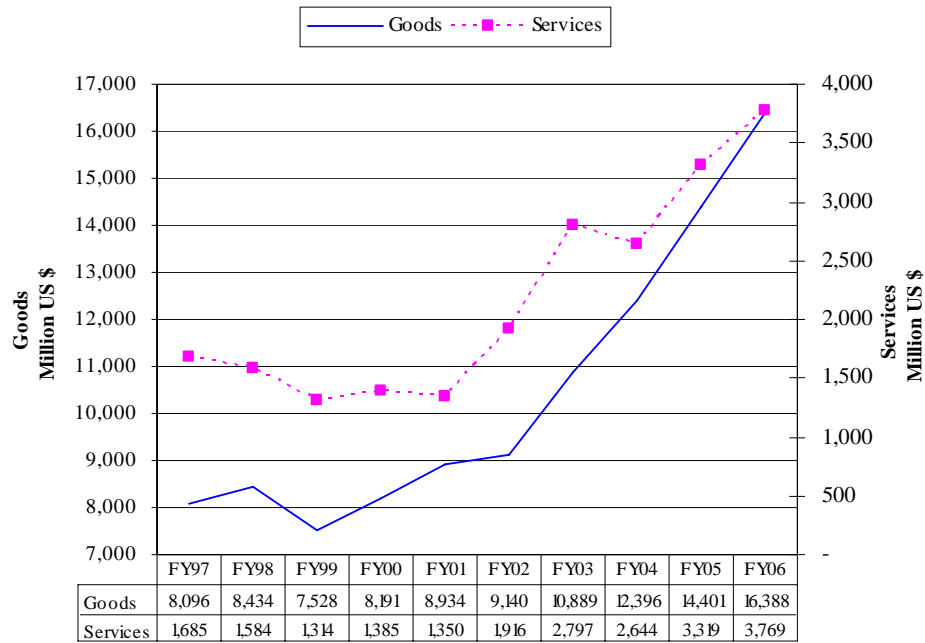
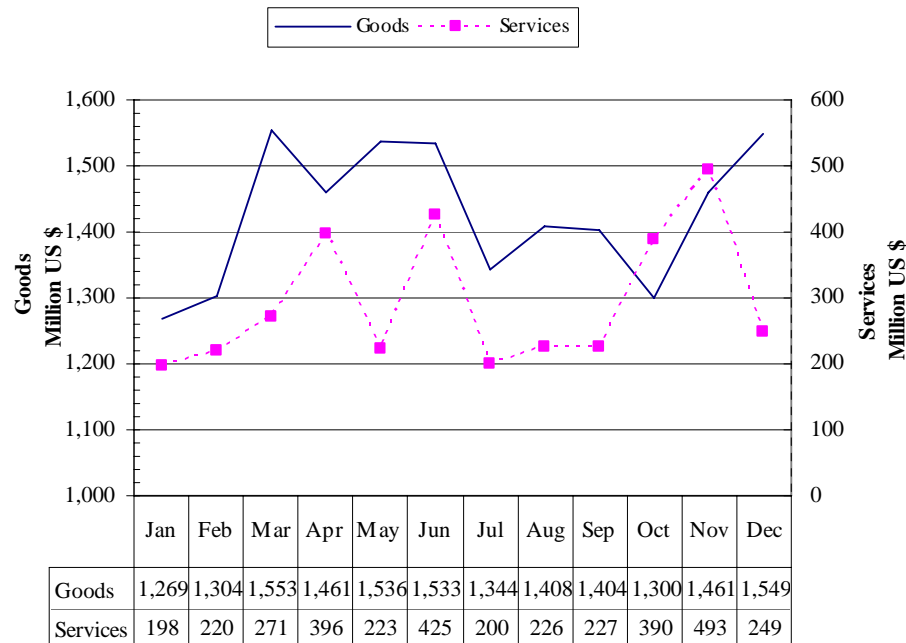
Figure 6: Annual Export of Goods & Services from FY97 to FY06**Figure 7: Monthly Export of Goods & Services**
