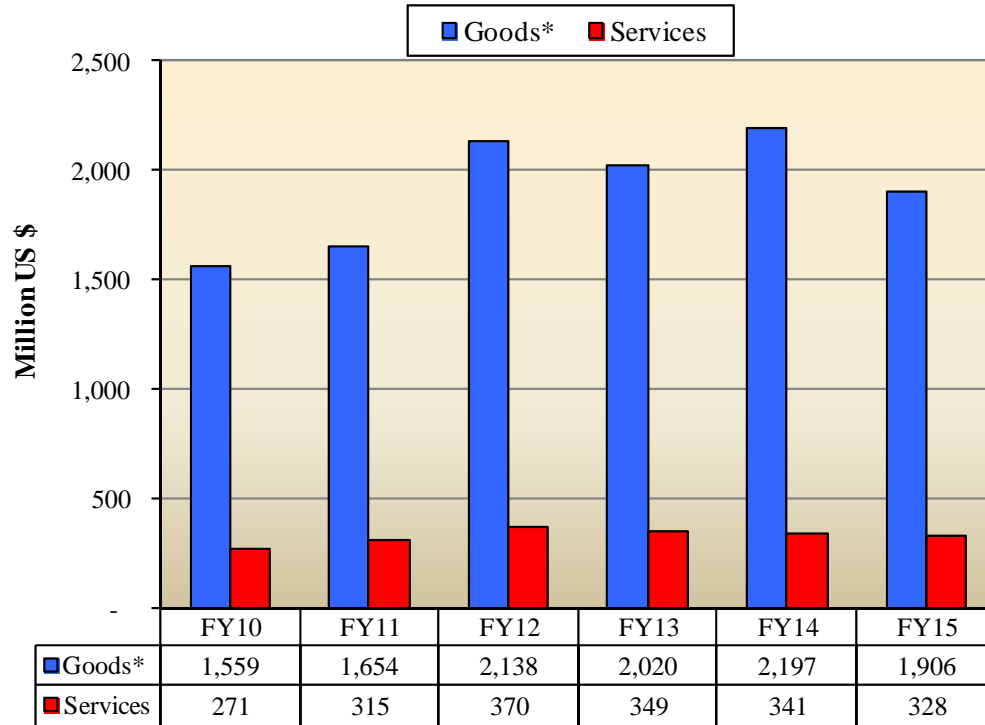
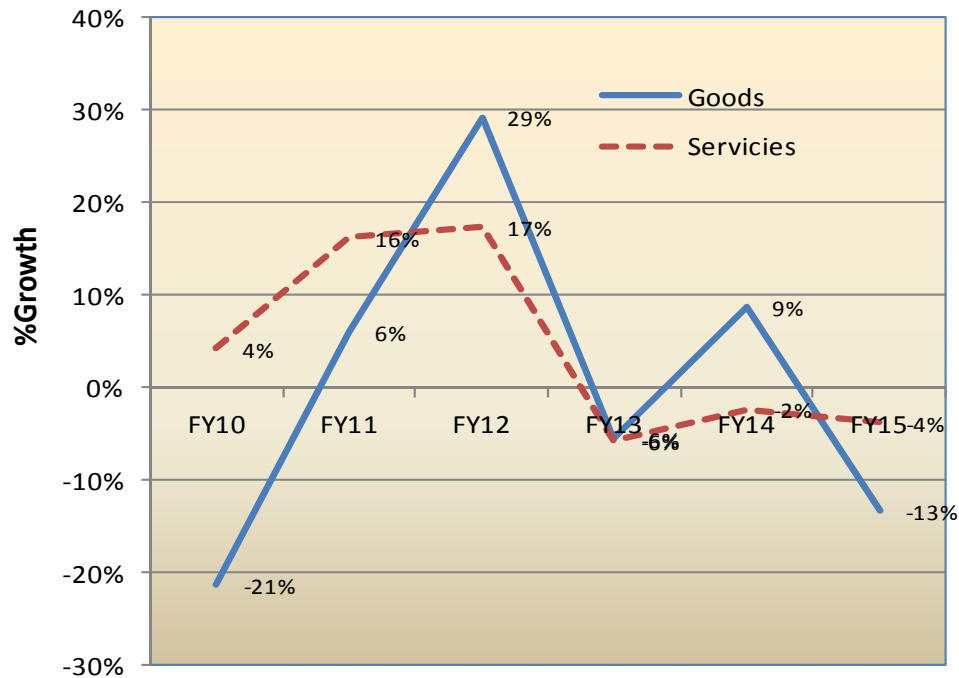

Figure 2: Percent Share of Major Commodity Groups in Export Receipts (Banks) of Goods

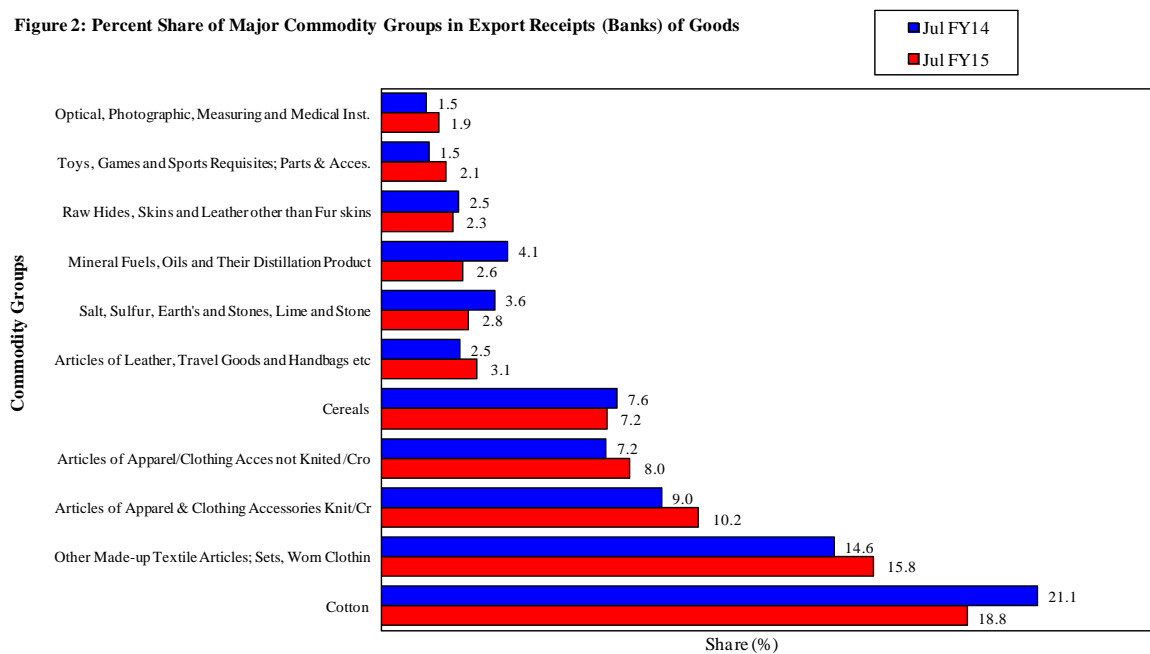


Figure 3: Export of Services

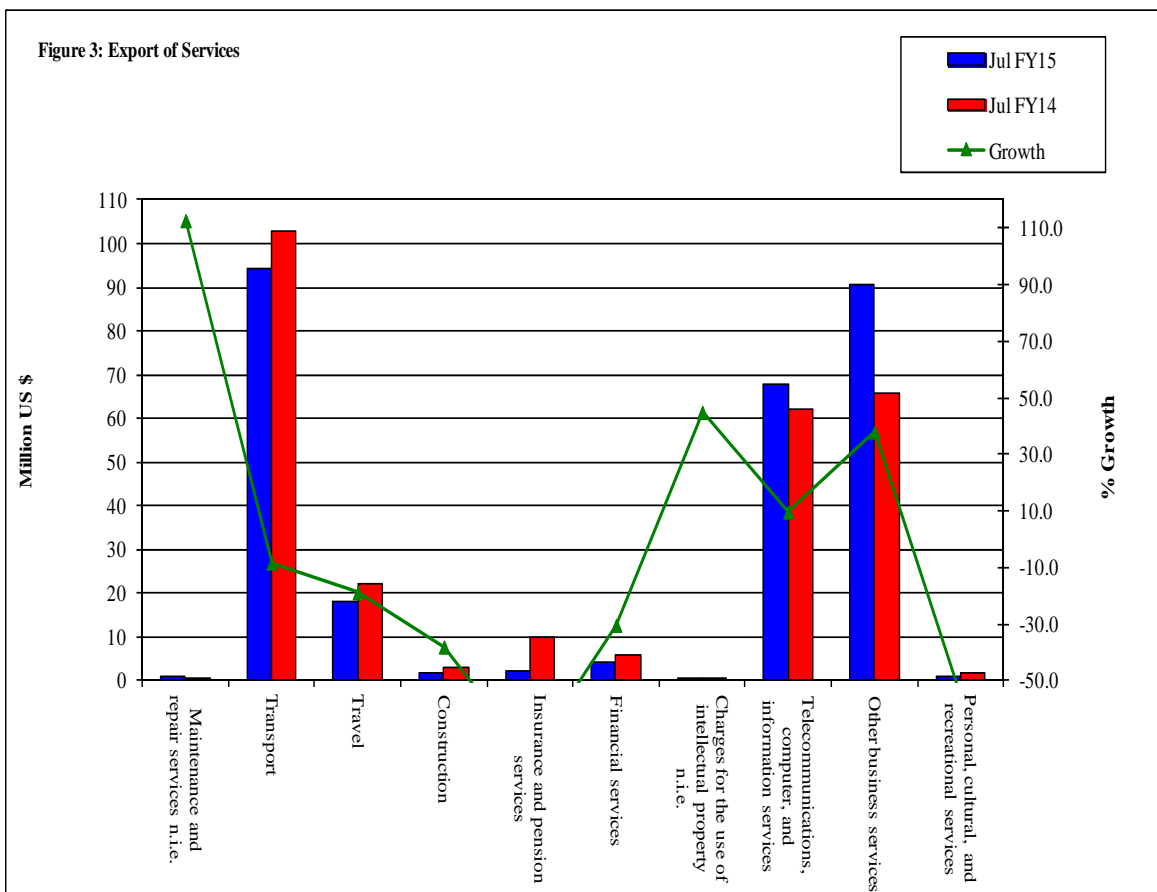
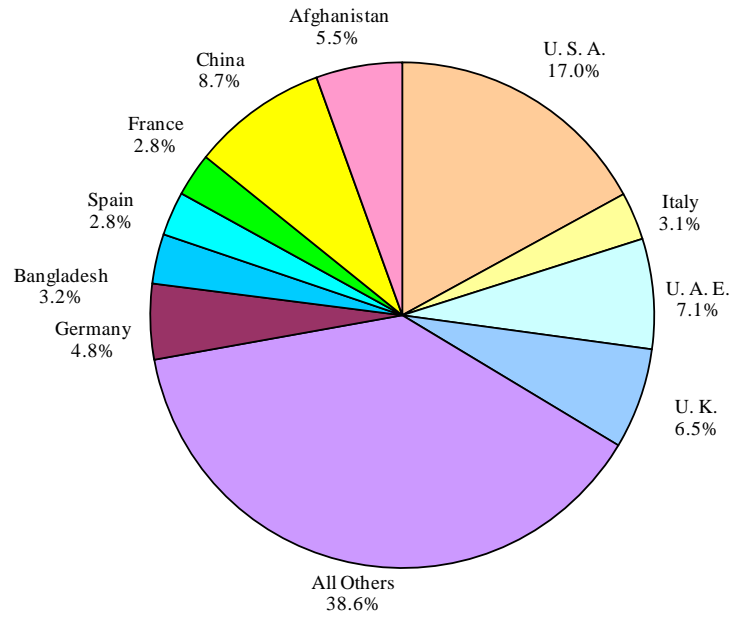
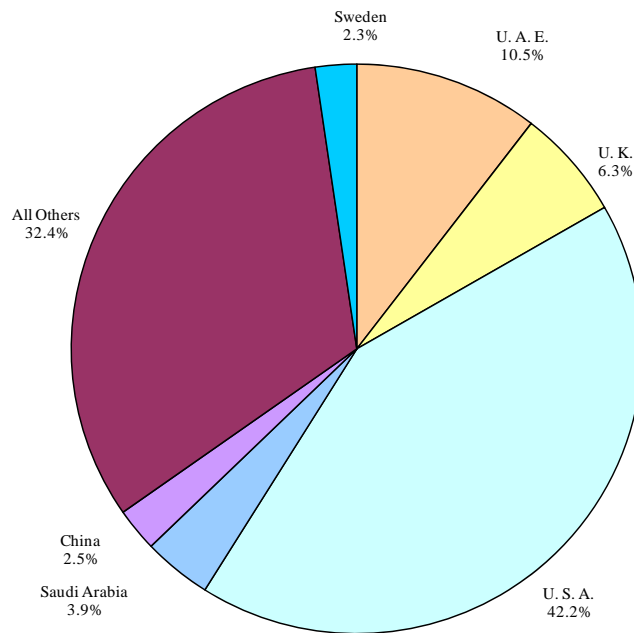

Figure 6: Annual Export of Goods & Services from FY02 to FY14

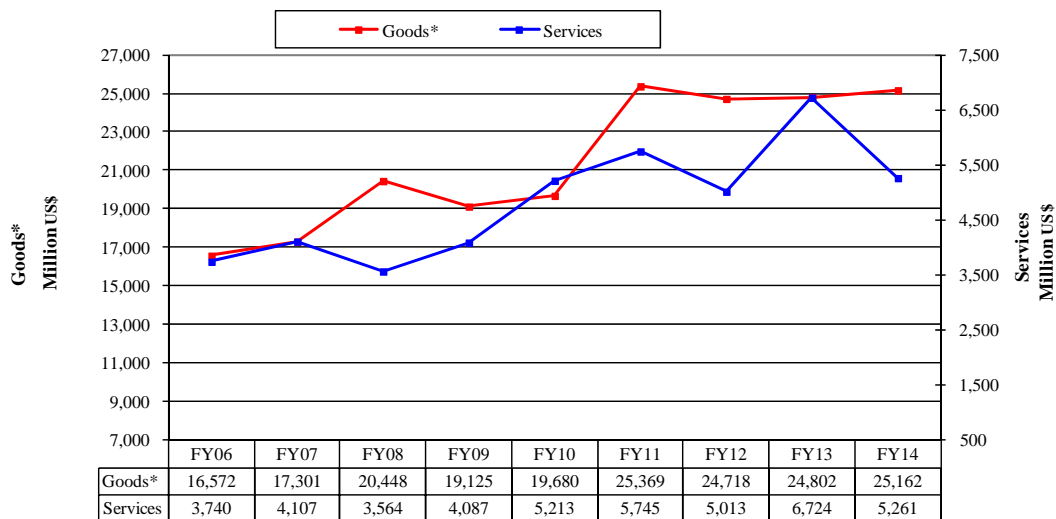
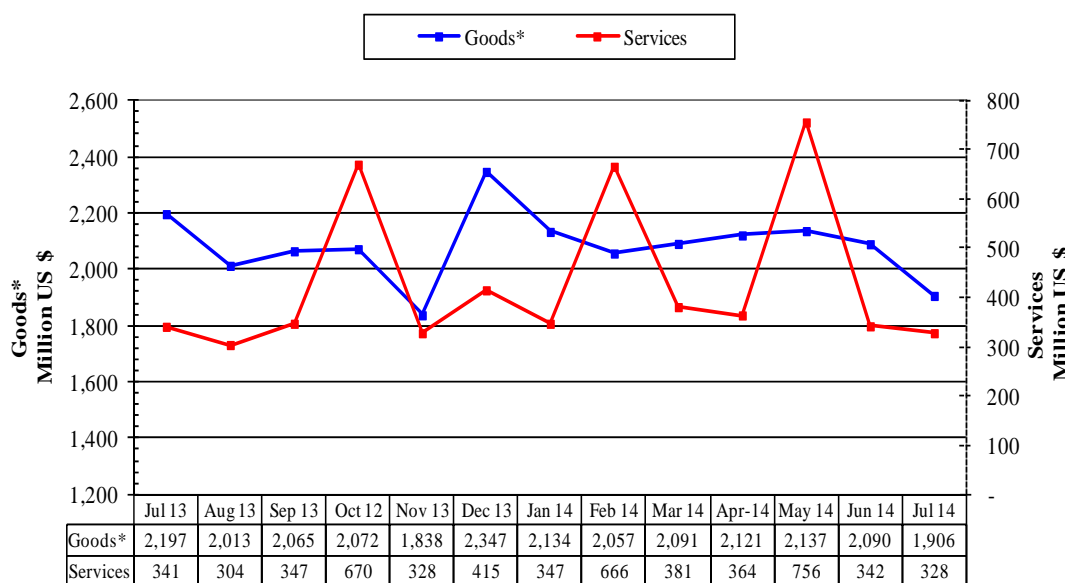


Figure 7: Monthly Export of Goods & Services
