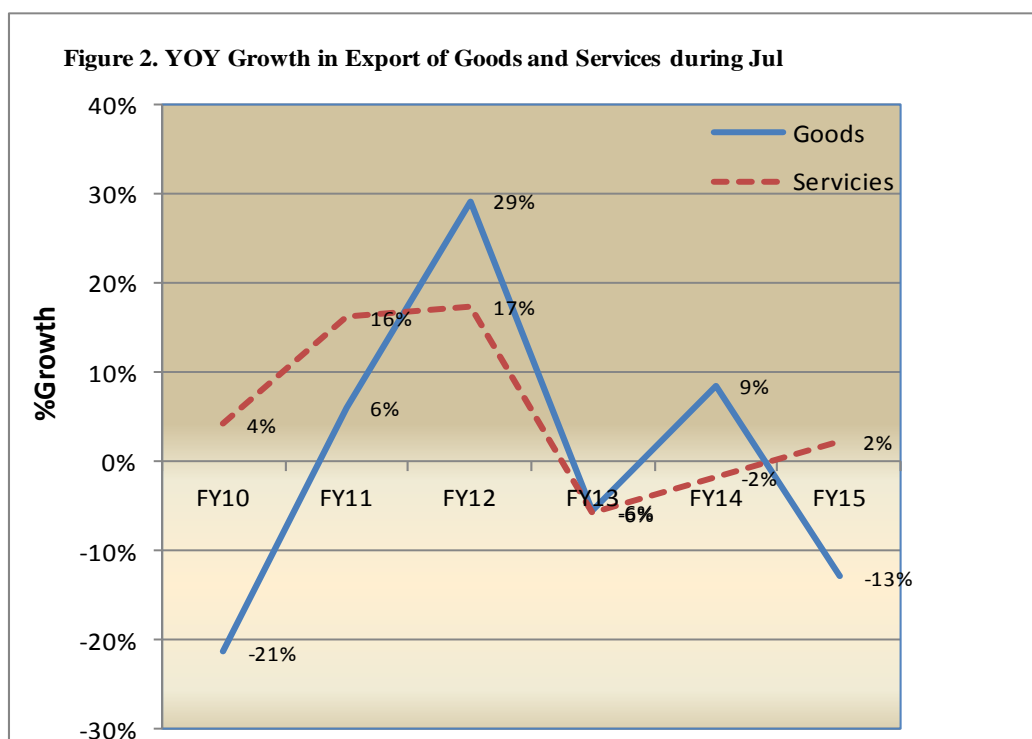
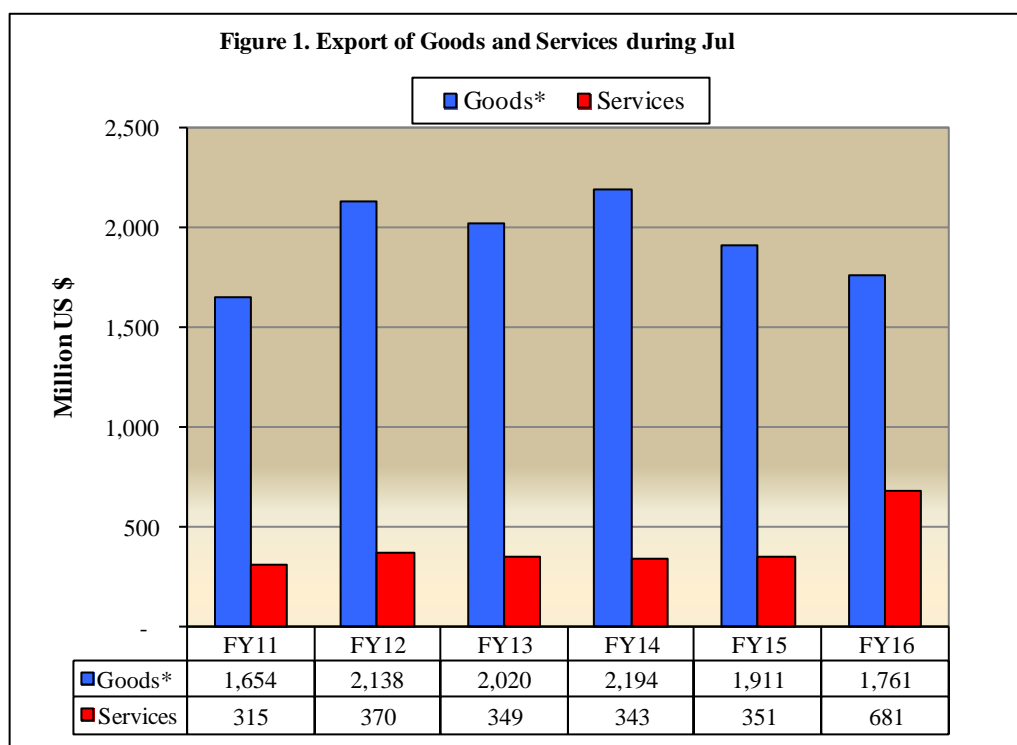

Figure 2: Percent Share of Major Commodity Groups in Export Receipts (Banks) of Goods

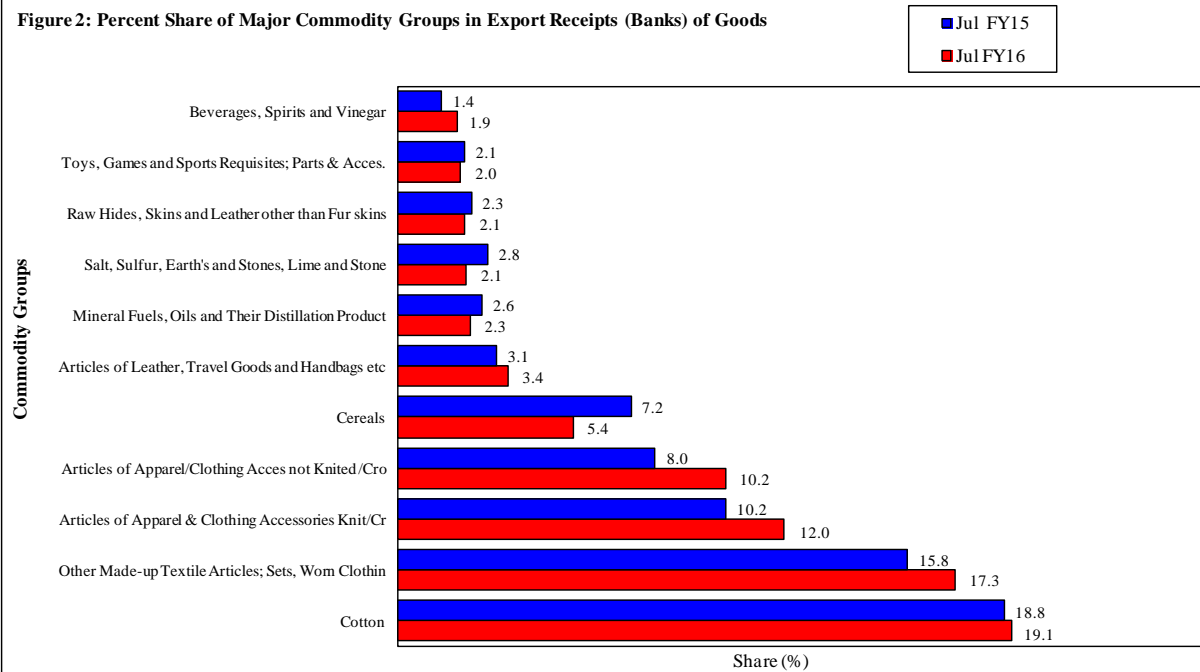


Figure 3: Export of Services

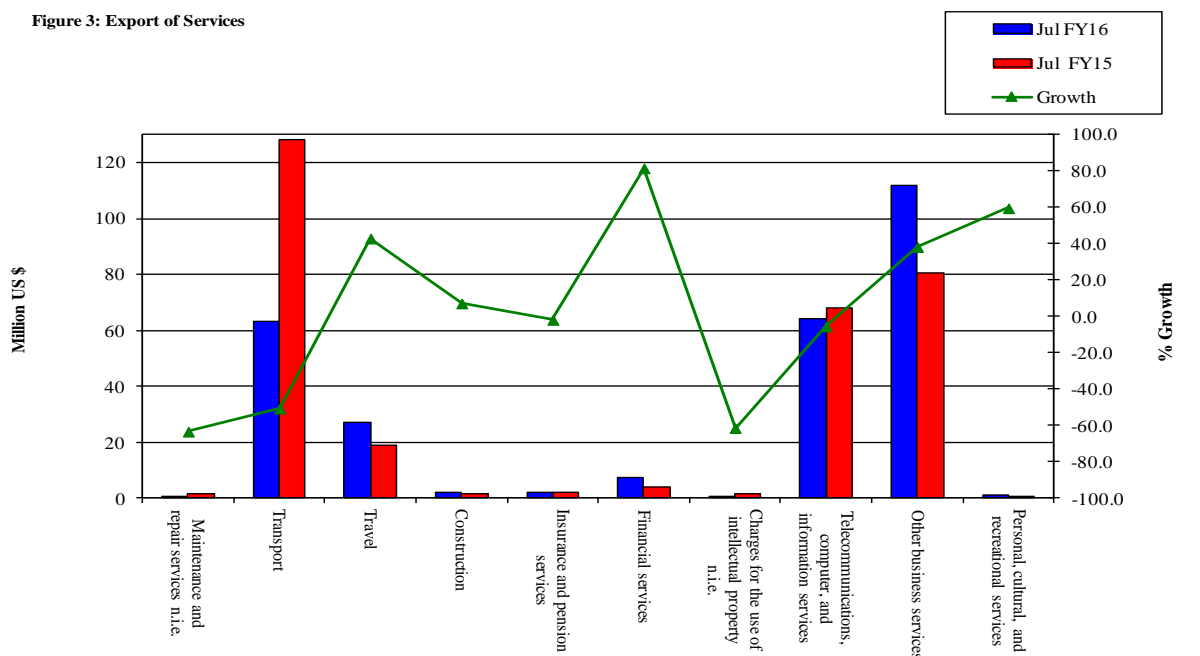
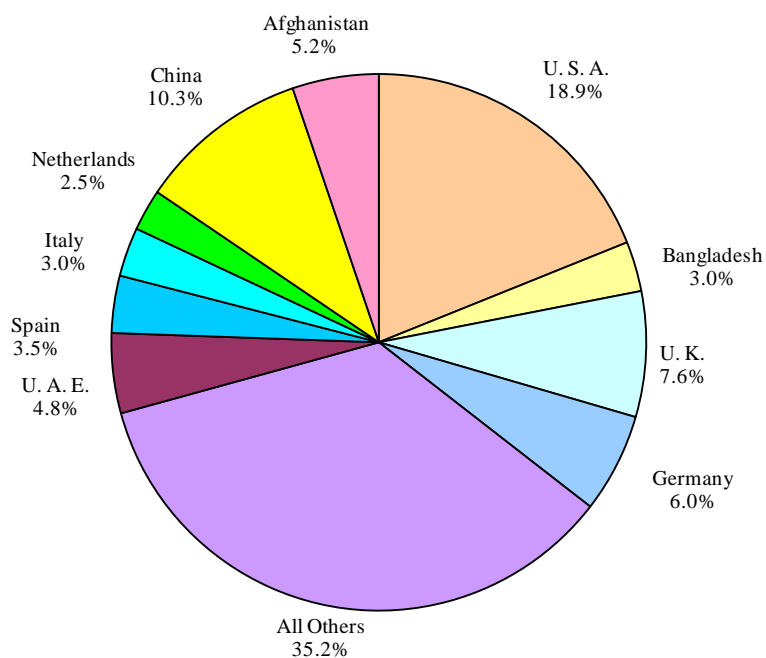
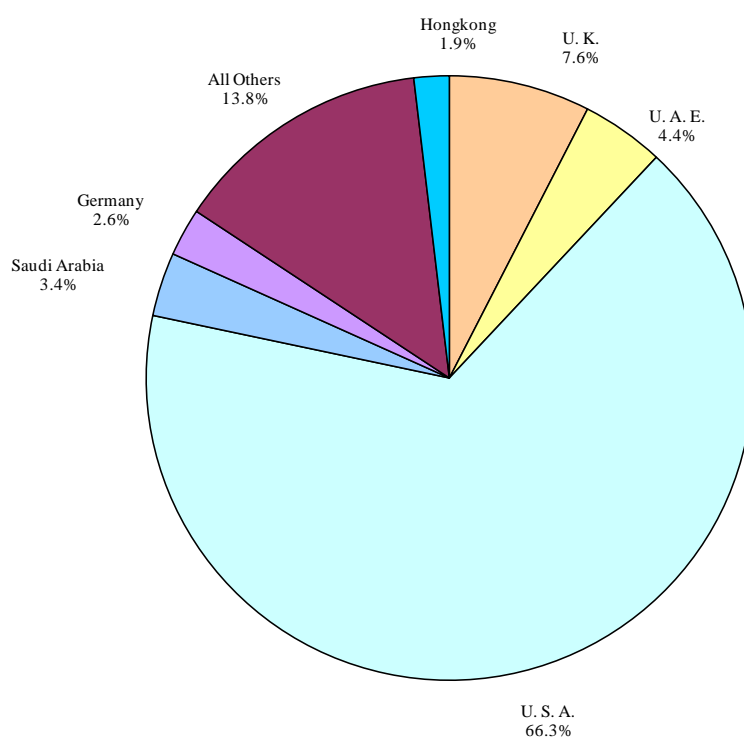


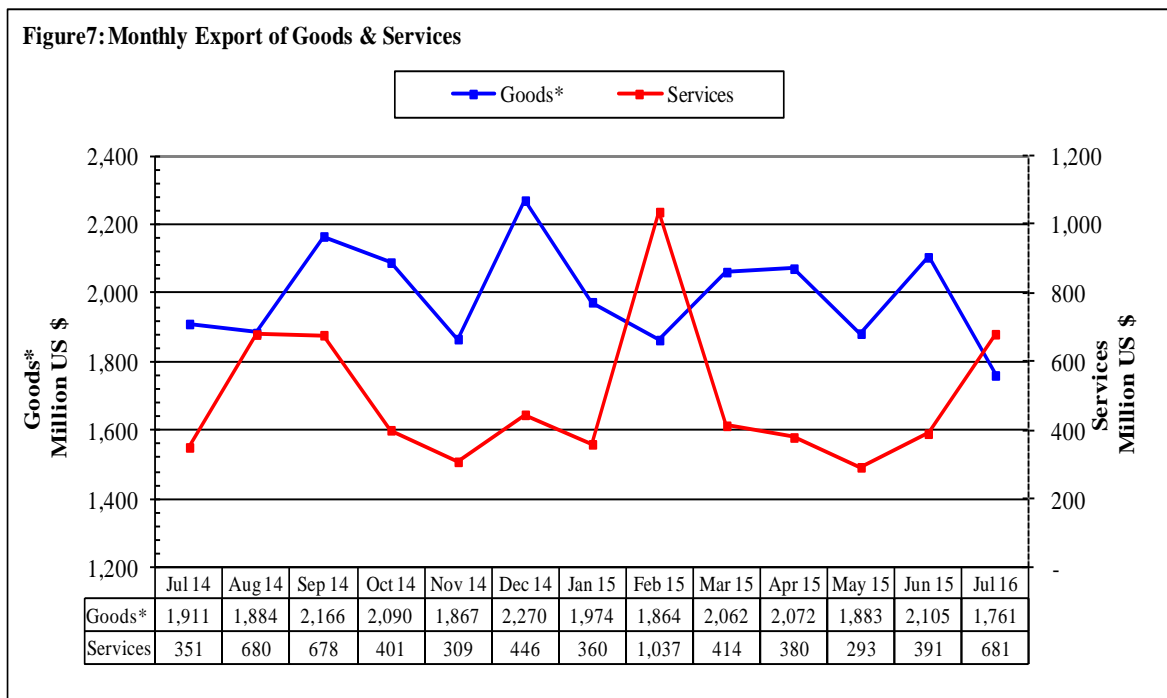
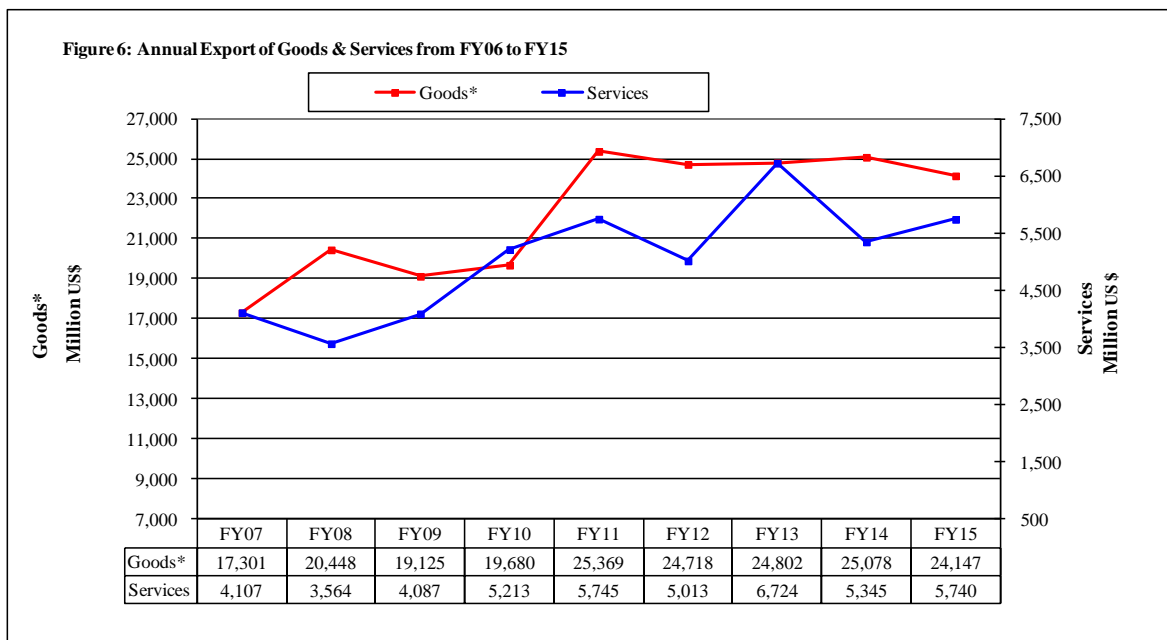
