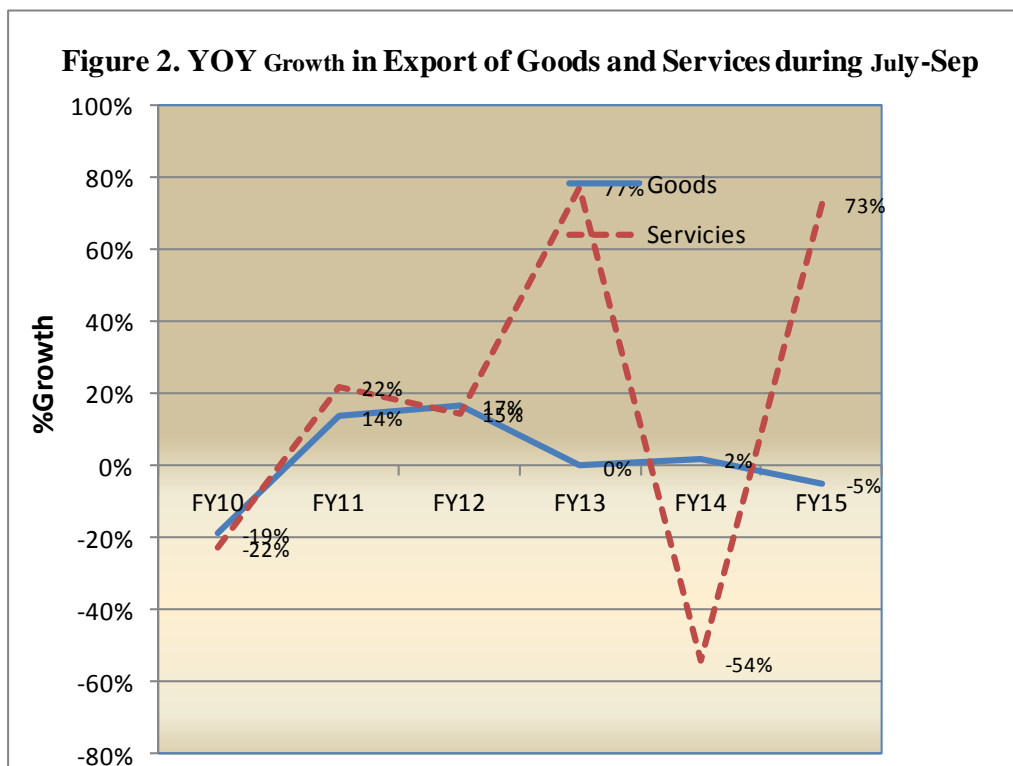
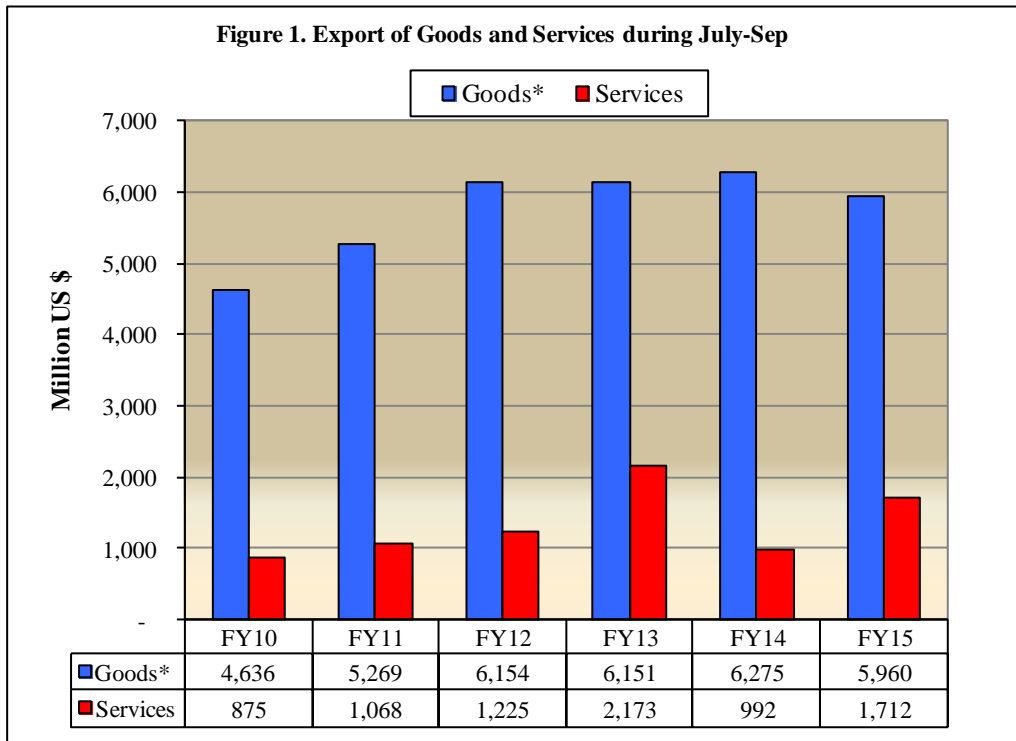

Figure 2: Percent Share of Major Commodity Groups in Export Receipts (Banks) of Goods

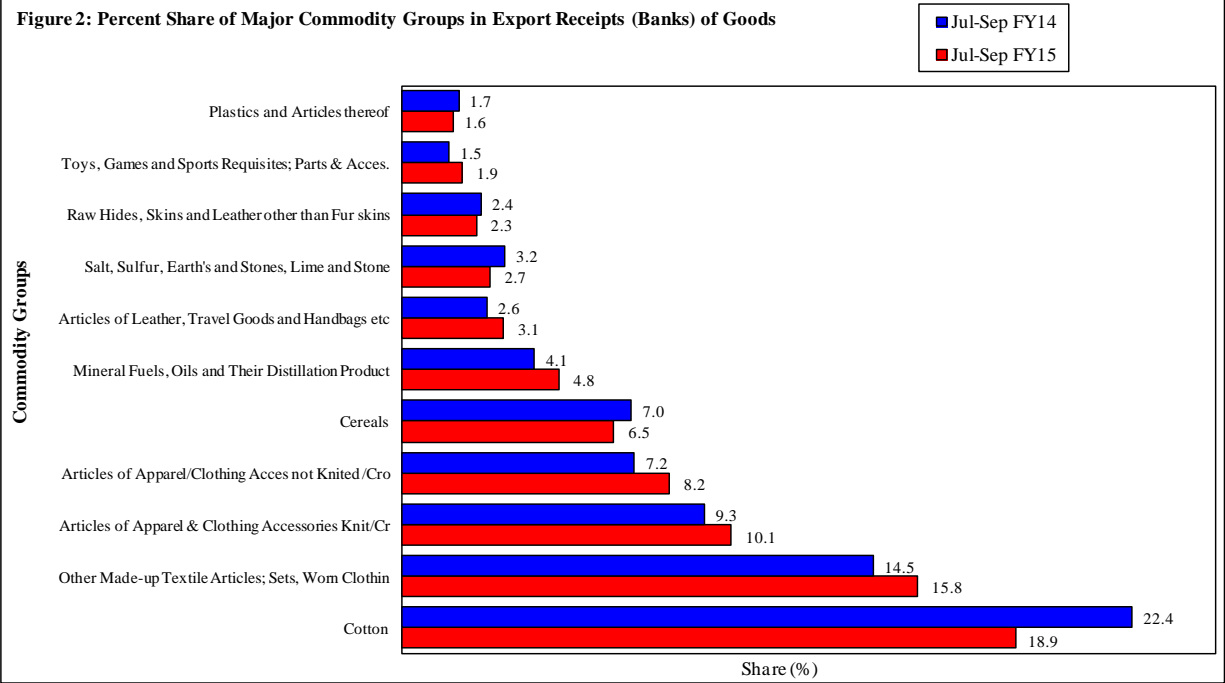
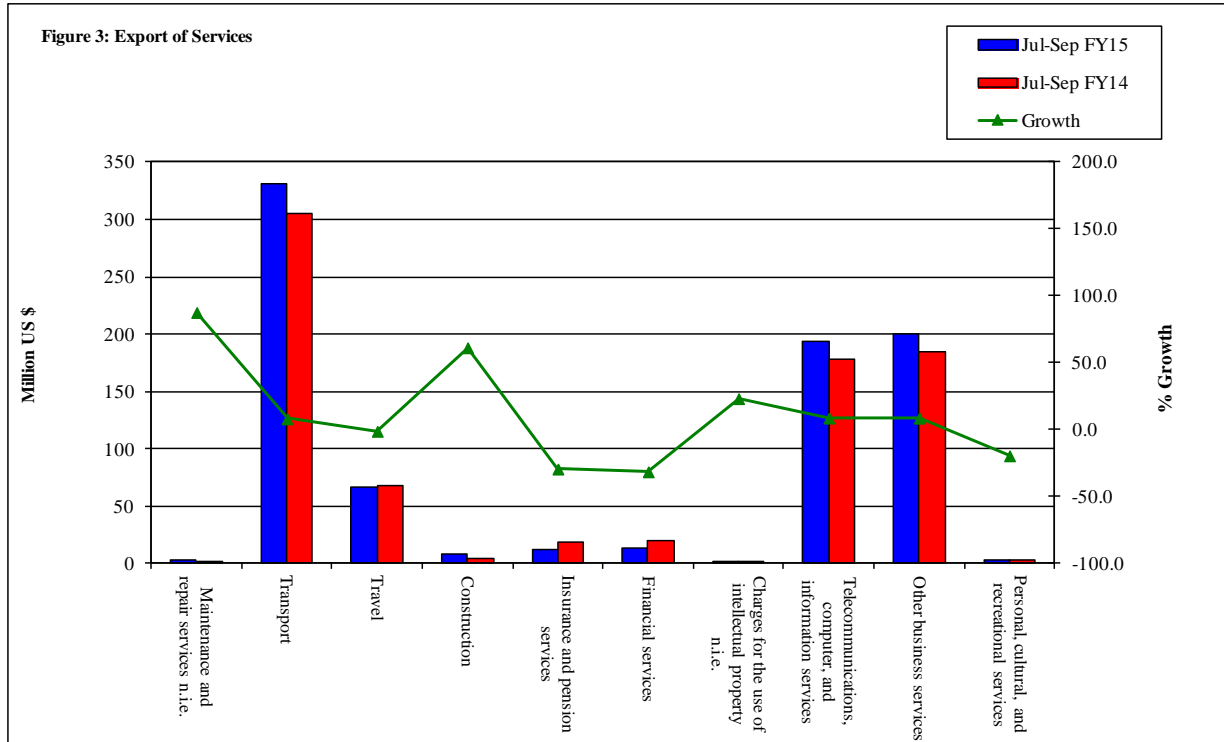


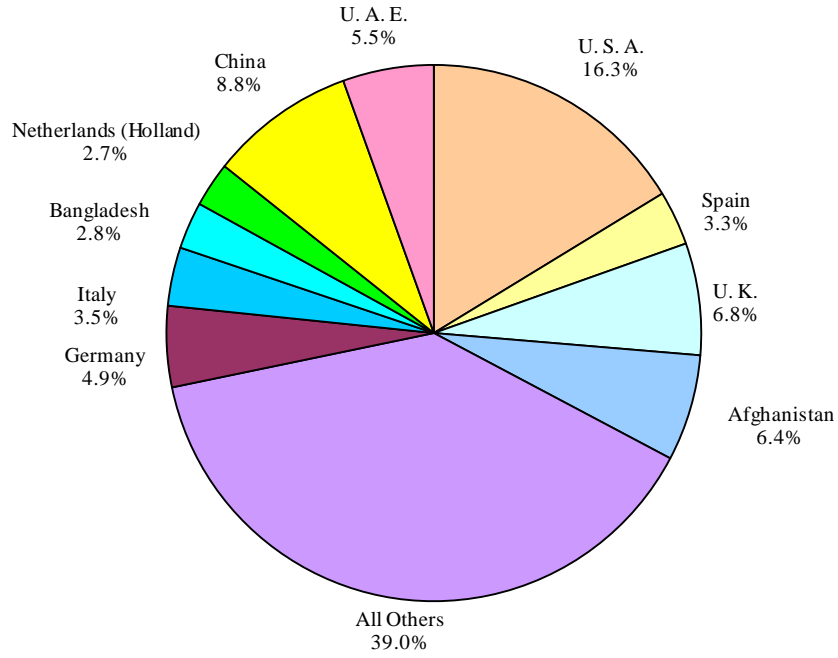
Figure 3: Export of Services



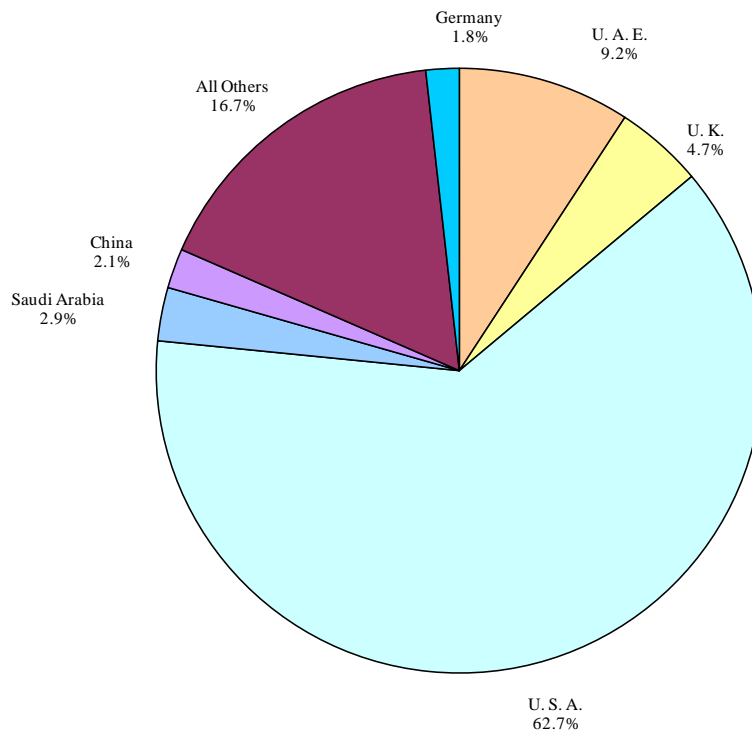

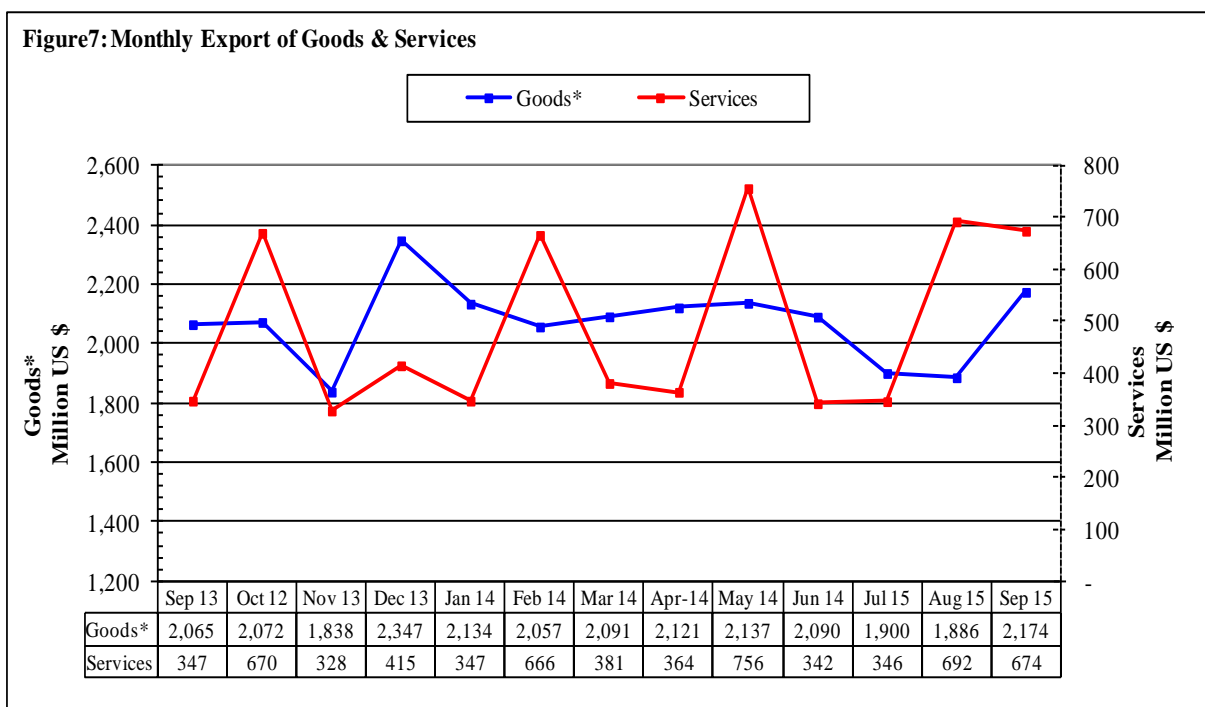
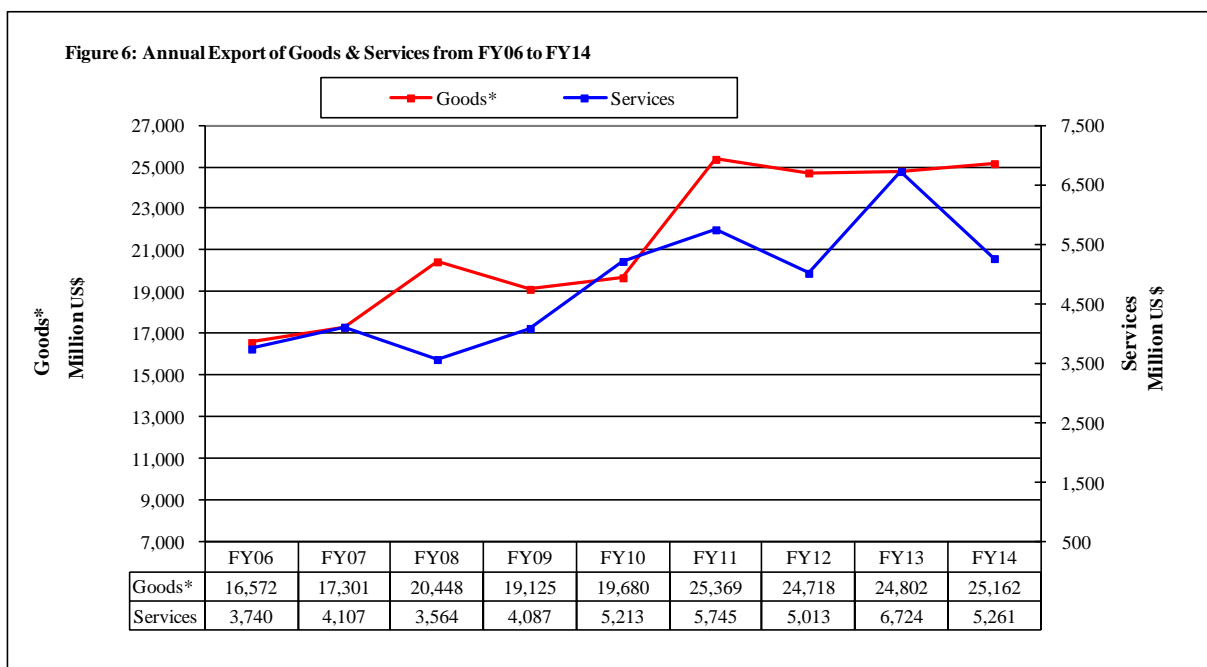
**Figure 4: % Share of Major Countries in Export Receipts (Banks) of Goods During Jul-Sep FY15**
