Figure 5: % Share of Major Countries in Imports Payments of Goods During Jul-May FY17

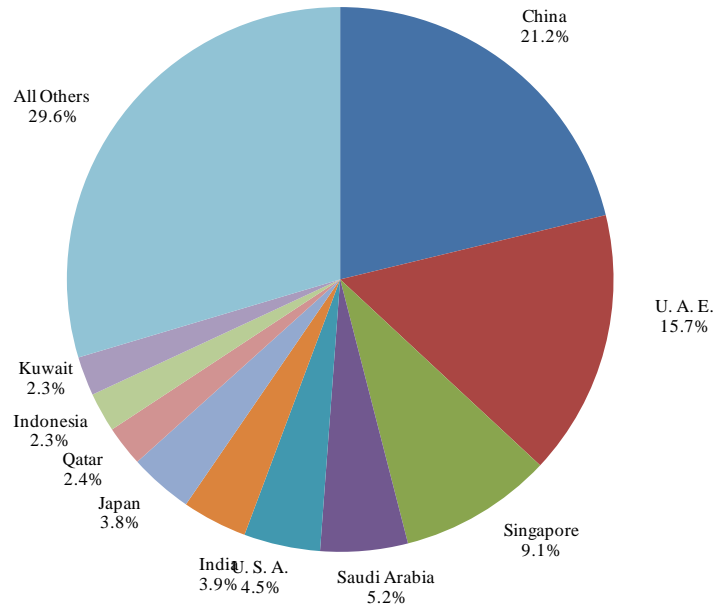
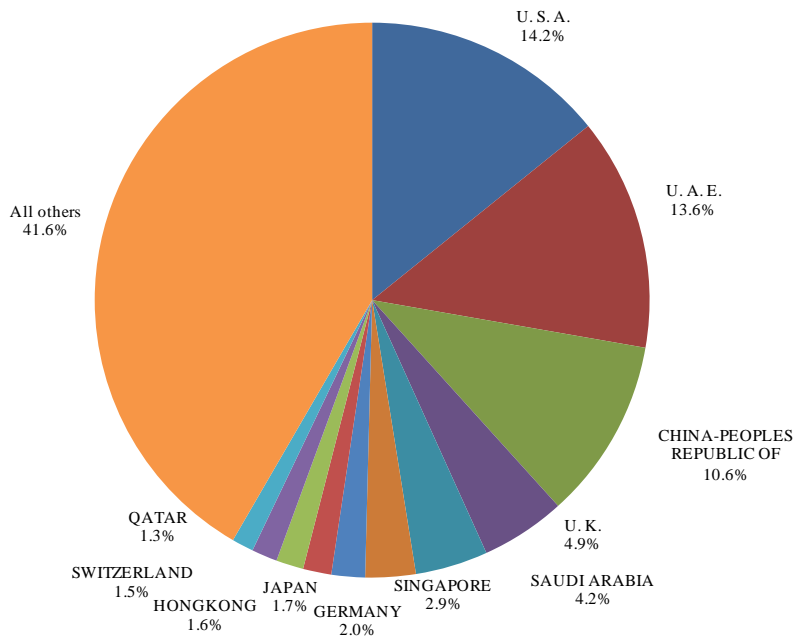
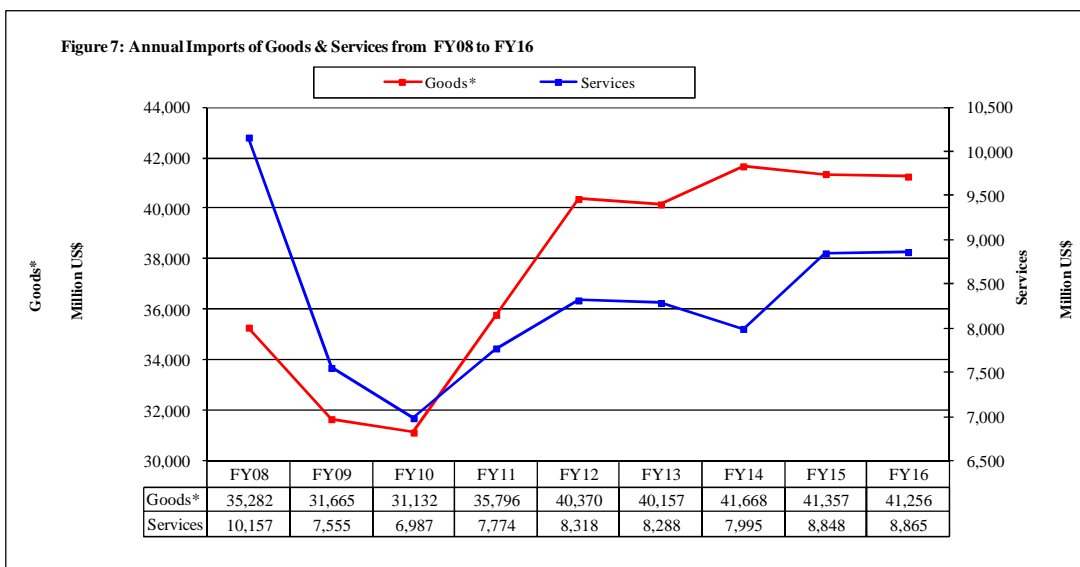


Figure 6: % Share of Major Countries in Imports of Services During Jul-May FY17

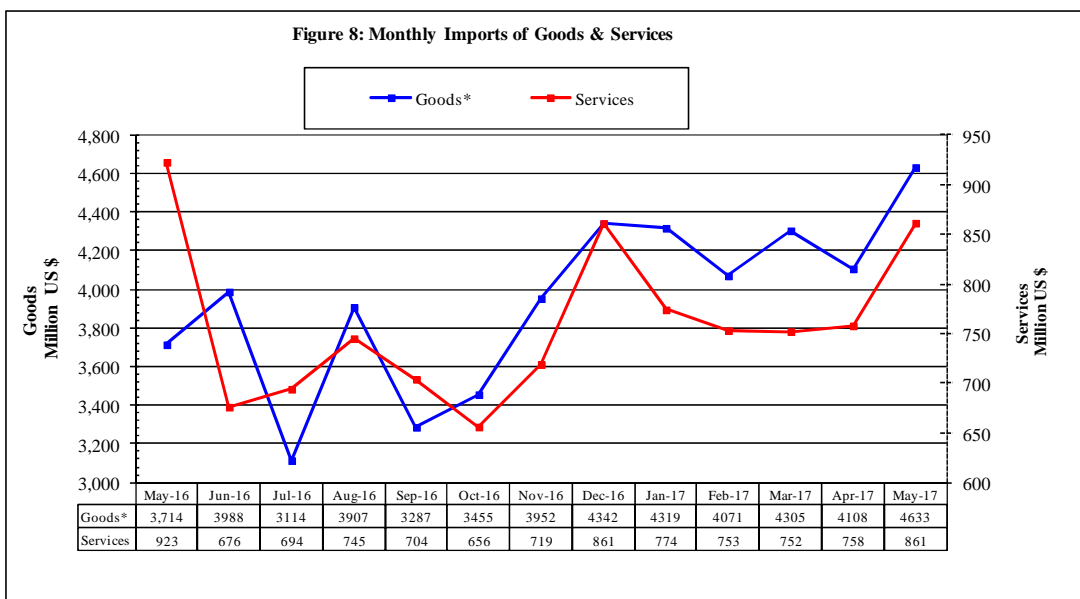
