Figure 1. Import of Goods and Services During Jul-Sep

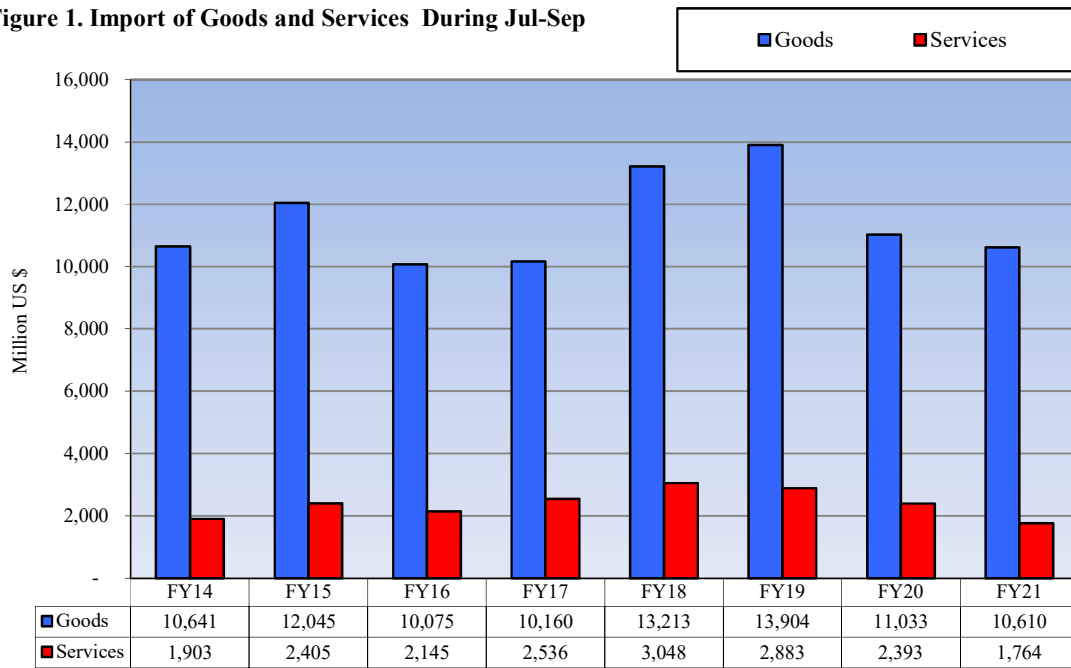


Figure 2: YOY Growth in Import of Goods & Services Jul-Sep

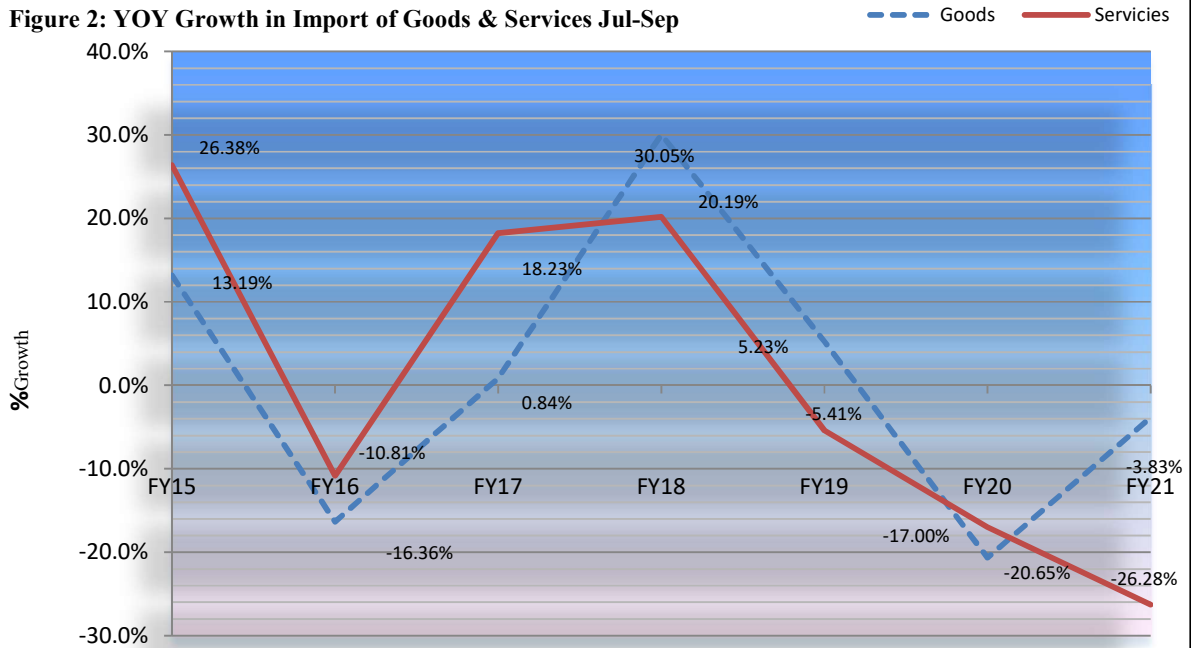

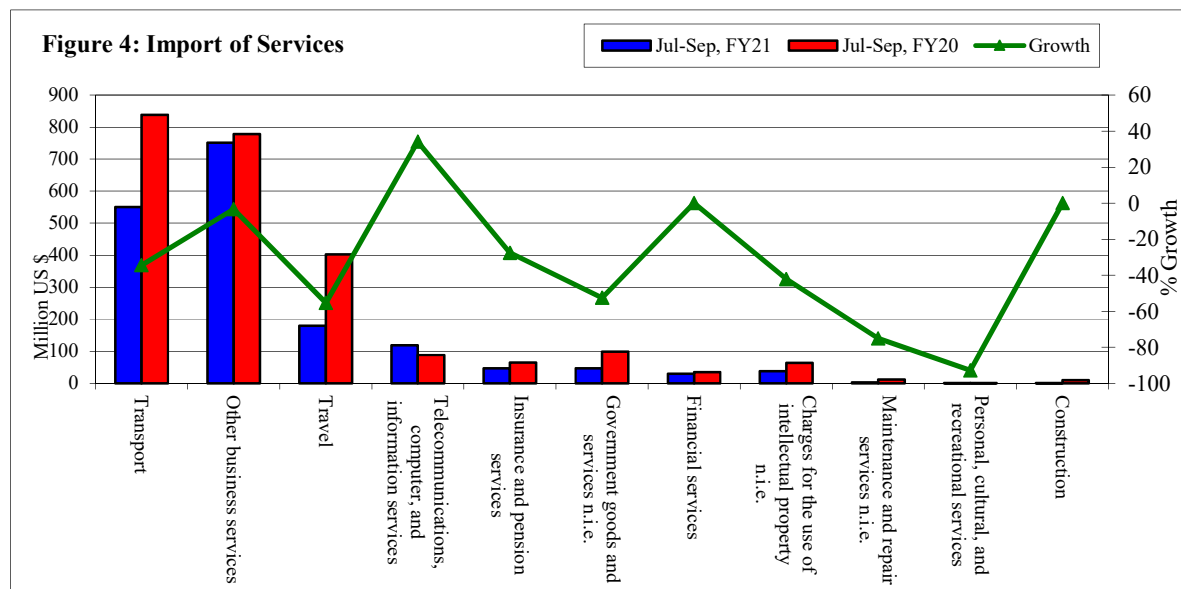
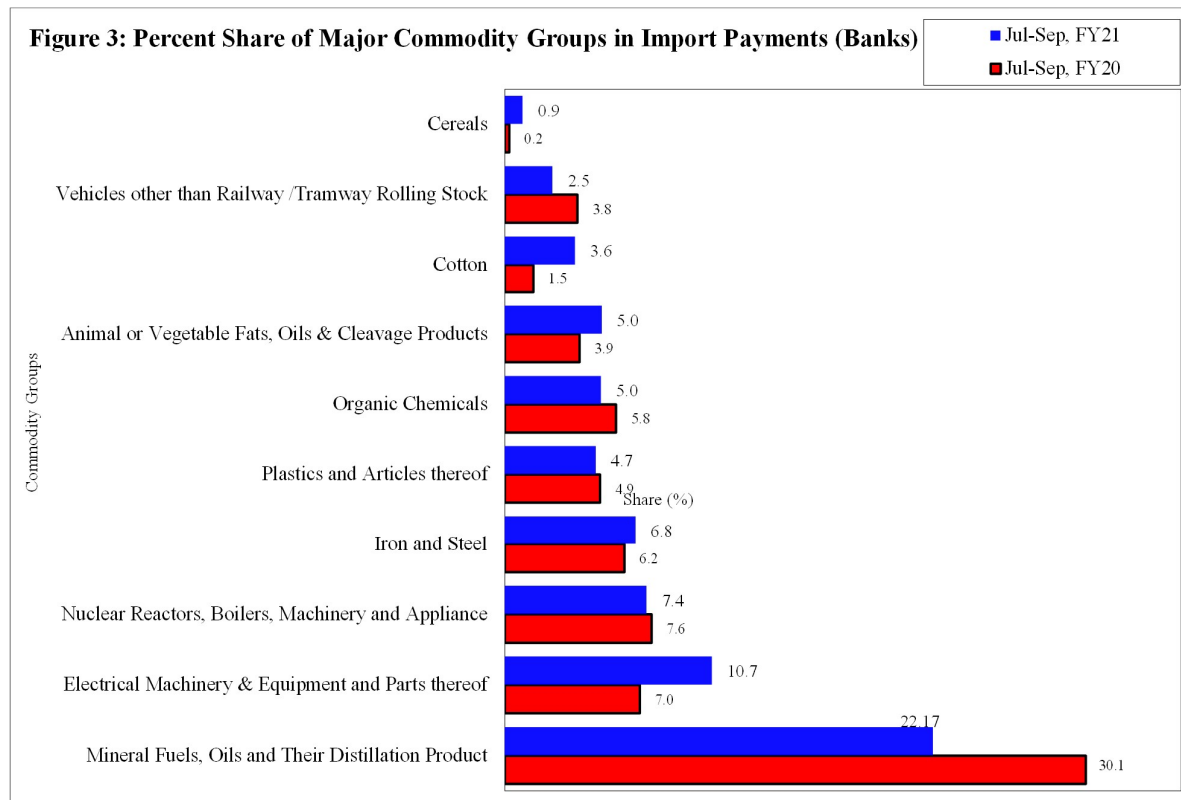

Figure 5: % Share of Major Countries in Import Payments of Goods During Jul-Sep, FY21

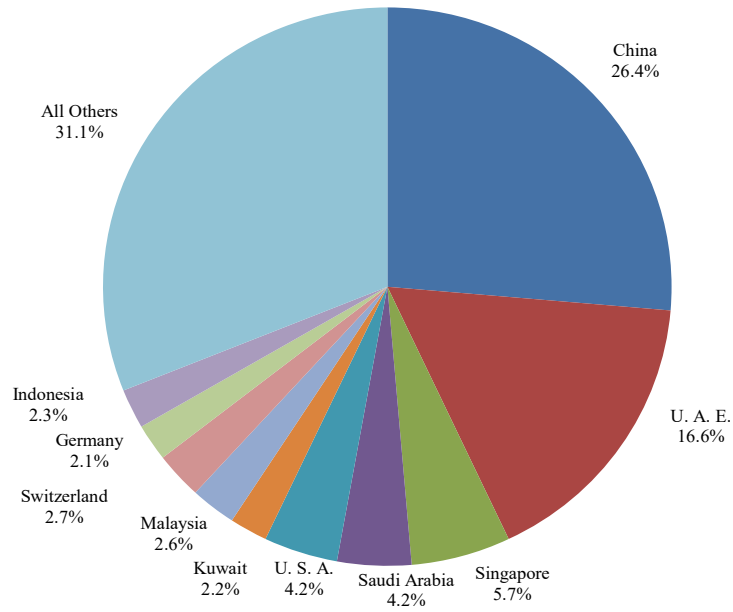
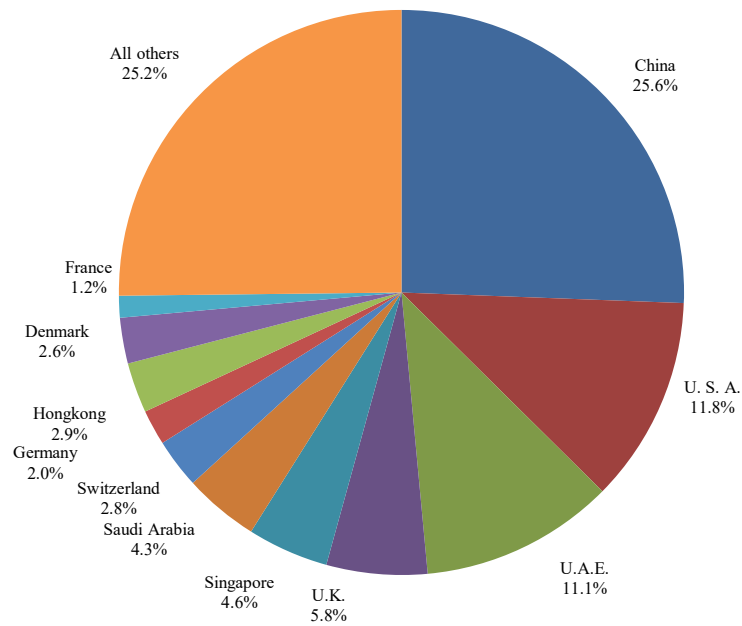


Figure 6: % Share of Major Countries in Import of Services During Jul-Sep, FY21

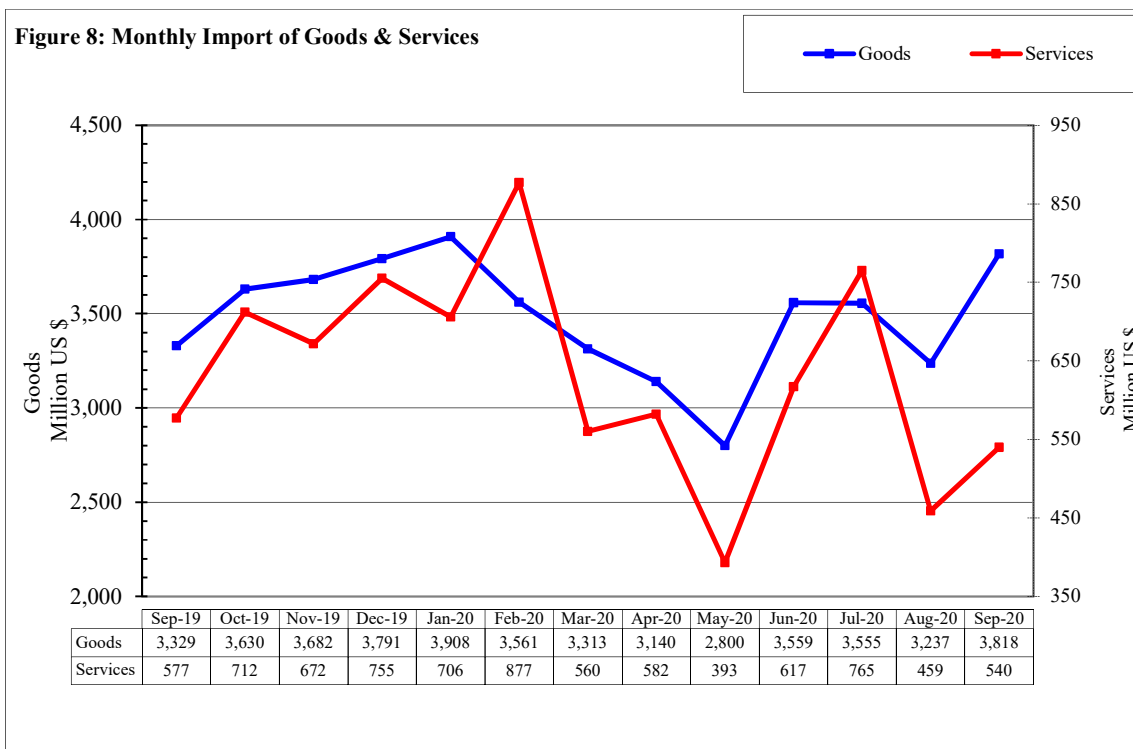
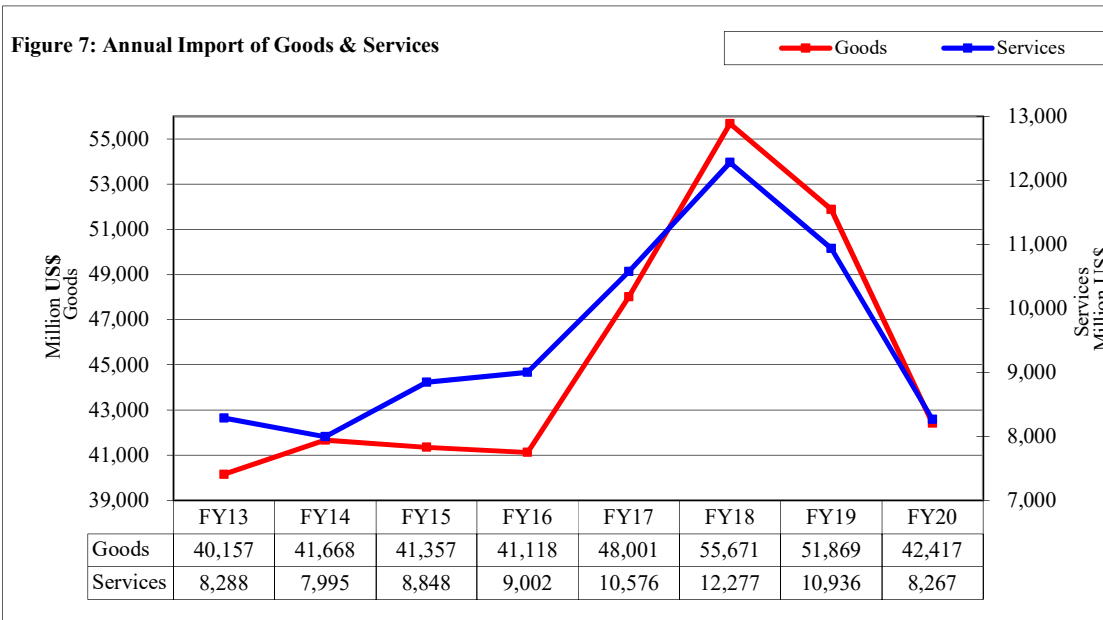
